#### TRAINING ON BAMBOO CHARCOAL PRODUCTION AND BRIQUETTING

**Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat (Assam)** conducted three-days Training Programme on "Bamboo Charcoal Production and Briquetting" under NMHS project on "*Promoting livelihood by bamboo charcoal production and briquetting to the selected forest fringe villages of Karbi Anglong District, Assam*", from 22-24 October, 2019.
