RFRI CONDUCTS VVK TRAINING AT ORANG NATIONAL PARK

Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat (Assam) in association with Mangaldoi Wildlife Division, Darrang (Assam) conducted Skill Development Training under Van Vigyan Kendra, Assam at Rajiv Gandhi Orang National Park, Mangaldoi (Assam) on 16-17 March, 2020. There were altogether 49 participants including Forest Field Functionaries, Eco-Development Committee Members, Farmers in the training.
