RFRI CELEBRATES WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY-2020

Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat celebrated World Environment Day-2020 at its Campus with various programmes. A plantation programme with ornamental bamboo was organized at RFRI Campus. It was inaugurated by Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tasa, Hon'ble Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha).

Addressing the gathering in the Conference Hall of the Institute, Shri Tasa expressed his anguish on the dwindling forest situation. He stressed on the need of transferring the findings of research of RFRI to the field so that common people get benefitted. He also mentioned about joblessness of thousands of people due to COVID-19 pandemic and suggested that RFRI must play a bigger role to impart skill trainings on many areas such as bamboo, agar, lac, cultivation of edible mushroom, vermicomposting etc., tom improve the livelihoods of those people.
